

Dear Parents/Guardians,

1. KEY DATES

Wednesday 1st September	All P1 to P7 pupils in school (Normal school day)

2. ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL

- Pupils should arrive at school between 8:30am 8:40am and begin lessons at 8:45am
- Upon arrival, pupils must walk directly to their classroom. Class Teachers/ Classroom Assistants will be present to greet the pupils as they arrive.
- Before entering the classroom, pupils must use the hand sanitiser provided.
- Parents/visitors are **not permitted** to enter the school building unless in exceptional circumstances.
- Morning prayers will take place in the classrooms with their class teachers and not in the school hall as a whole school.

Pupil entrance doors:

- P1/P2/P4/P6 pupils will use the back door at the P1 and P2 playground.
- P3/P5/P7 pupils will use the main school entrance door.

3. HOME COLLECTION TIMES

From Tuesday 31st August, school finishing times will be as follows.

- Primary 1 children will follow a phased induction during the month of September as detailed in the P1 Induction Booklet and in the above table.
- Primary 1 children can be accompanied by a parent/guardian to the P1 classroom door for the first week if necessary.
- P3 to P7 children will be brought to the staff car park by their class teacher at the end of the school day.



- They will line up in their class groups and collected as normal as they see parents/guardians arrive. Can we ask all parents/guardians/family members to be punctual when collecting their child/children.
- Children who have permission to walk home will be safely escorted by a staff member to the footpath at the main car park gate.

Home collection in the event of inclement weather conditions:

- P1 & P2 pupils can be collected from the P1/P2 Small Playground.
- P4 & P6 pupils can be collected from the P1/P2 Small Playground.
- P3/P5/P7 pupils can be collected from the exit door at the school hall next to staff car park.
- There will be **NO** parking allowed in the staff car park area at home collection times. This area will remain coned off and kept free to allow the children to line up at the end of the school day. Parents/guardians can collect the children and move swiftly to their vehicle with awareness of other adults and children in the area.
- Whilst collecting children, we would urge all parents/guardians to always follow the PHA guidelines. Please do not congregate in groups, wear a face covering and observe social distancing.
- Please inform all adults that collect your child/ children of these arrangements.

4. SCHOOL BREAK/LUNCH TIMES

- School will continue to provide toast for each child at break time. They will have their own period of outside play in a designated area of the playground during break time.
- It is essential that coats are brought to school by pupils each day. Pupils will be brought outside during breaktime, irrespective of the weather, to allow time away from the classroom. (Except in extreme circumstances).
- Pupils will follow a similar routine at lunchtime whereby they will eat their lunch in the school hall, followed by a period of play outside in a designated area of the playground with their own class.
- Pupils' healthy break and those taking packed lunch should bring their items of food in disposable wrapping or in a washable/wipeable container.
- All children need their own water bottle which will come into school every day. This bottle should be clearly labelled and thoroughly cleaned daily. Children will not be able to refill their bottles throughout the day.
- Remember NO nut products of any sort at any time.

5. SCHOOL UNIFORM

- Children are required to wear school uniform as normal and to change when they go home each day. We would encourage clean uniforms as often as possible.
- Please ensure all items of uniform are clearly labelled with your child's name.
- Children should bring a coat to school each day, to maximise the use of outdoor learning.

6. SCHOOL MEALS & TRANSPORT

• School meals will resume on Wednesday 1st September 2021. Classes will eat their dinner/ lunch in their class bubbles in the school dining hall.



- For those taking packed lunch, pupils should bring their items of food in disposable packaging or in a washable/wipeable container/lunchbox which are cleaned daily.
- School dinners cost £2.60 daily and £13 weekly. Please send correct money in a labelled envelope/clear money bag for your child's teacher to collect.
- A copy of the school dinner menu will be made available on our school website.

7. SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

- All communication with parents will be carried out via our School Website. (The Schools NI app is linked to our website). We would ask that all parents download the Schools NI app and update settings by sending test notification and restarting notifications on your mobile device in order to receive messages and updates from our messaging system.
- The school Twitter and Facebook accounts will also be linked to our school website homepage.
- Please refer to the calendar on our website, which will be updated regularly with dates for your diary. The school holiday list has been made available in the parents' section of the website.
- It is important that school has the most up to date contact information for all our pupils and parents. You will be asked to complete a pupil data collection information form on our school website to ensure all pupil records are updated accordingly.

8. MEDICATION

• Pupil medication e.g. inhalers should be brought into school on the first day back and will be kept in school from that point in a sealed bag/container. Any new or updated medical information or reports should be shared immediately with the school.

9. EQUIPMENT AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS

- School bags may now be brought to and from school each day. We have included a copy of the stationery list for each class, and we urge that all items be clearly labelled. Children are asked to keep this stationery in school.
- The pencil case should remain in school, and it will be used only by them. We would encourage you to have a second well stocked pencil case at home for completing homework tasks.
- Please encourage your child to take care of their belongings and ensure that they place them in their pencil case after use.

HEALTH AND SAFETY / COVID-19 PREVENTATION / PERSONAL HYGIENE

We consider the Health and Safety of our pupils, staff and wider school community to be of utmost importance. In line with Government suggestions, we have put the following measures in place.

SOCIAL DISTANCING

- Throughout the school building there will be signage to remind pupils, staff and parents of social distance requirements and hygiene practices to be used in school.
- It is important to remind parents/carers not to congregate in groups at entrance or exit gates/doors. We would urge all parents/guardians to always follow the PHA guidelines, wear a face covering and observe social distancing at all times.

PROTECTIVE BUBBLES

- Educational settings are no longer required to operate a system of formal protective bubbles. However, the
 need for educational settings to continue to support effective contact tracing means that they are asked to
 maintain a cautious and measured approach that still seeks to maximise the time where pupils are within a
 consistent group of pupils.
- With consistent class membership limiting contact between groups of children is the main risk mitigation measure for children attending school.

LIMITING VISITORS

- For everyone's safety, parents, visitors and members of the public are **not permitted** to enter into the school building unless in exceptional circumstances or by prior appointment. Where parents are admitted into the school building, it should be conducted safely, observing social distancing and hygiene measures. This is of vital importance to protect and ensure the health, safety and well-being of everyone in our school and wider school community.
- Primary 1 children can be accompanied by a parent/guardian to the P1 classroom door for the first week if necessary.
- If you need to speak to class teachers, we ask that you do so by telephone. We ask for your full cooperation with this requirement and please understand this is for the safety of all.
- We would like to make parents aware that if their child needs to be accompanied to school, only **one** parent should attend.

SANITISING STATIONS

 Hand sanitisers will be readily available throughout the school. (main entrance/exit doors and all classrooms). Children will be encouraged to use the hand sanitiser as well as full hand washing throughout the day.

REGULAR HANDWASHING

- Promotion of regular and thorough attention to hygiene through regular hand washing and good respiratory hygiene, following the "Catch it, Bin it, Kill it" approach.
- Children will be requested by staff to wash their hands regularly throughout the school day.
- It is essential that all children are reminded of the significance of personal hygiene as they return to school, particularly around the importance of regular handwashing. We encourage you to continue practising with your children the washing of hands for at least 20 seconds using liquid soap and water and drying them thoroughly.



STAFF PPE

• School staff may wear PPE (such as visors, aprons or gloves) if they are required to work in close proximity with a child or to perform first aid if required.

COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

• If your child is displaying any of the symptoms of COVID-19, they should remain at home and follow the latest Public Health advice.

Symptoms of Covid-19 include:-

- > a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back, or;
- > a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual), or;
- > anosmia the loss or a change in your normal sense of smell (it can also affect your sense of taste)
- If any child presents as unwell, the school has a non-contact thermometer which may be used. The child
 will be brought to an individual room where they can wait in isolation with a member of staff while medical
 advice is sought, and parents/guardians contacted. The staff member will remain with the child until
 collected.
- If there is a confirmed case of someone in the school having the COVID-19 Virus, the school will follow the latest PHA and DE advice.
