TRAVELLING BOOK FAIR

Thank you to everyone who purchased books at our recent Book Fair. We sold just over £1100 in books and the school received £635 in commission which will go towards purchasing new reading resources for the school. Thank you to Mr O'Neill organising the Book Fair and to the P7 children for assisting with the sales.

BOOK DONATION REQUEST

To inspire the children's reading, we are constantly updating the provision of books in our classrooms, school library and Accelerated Reader library. If any family have novels or reading books that they feel they don't need anymore, we would greatly appreciate them. You can either leave books with your child's teacher or the School Office. We are always very grateful for your generosity.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

The children as always look fantastic in their school uniform and a big thank you to all parents / guardians for supporting our uniform guidelines.

We expect the pupils to always wear full school uniform as it gives a sense of identity, reflects the individuality of the school and contributes to our school ethos.

School uniform can be purchased from O'Neill's Store Magherafelt. All items of clothing should be marked clearly with pupil's name

Our school uniform policy consists of school half zip top, school jersey and school tracksuit bottoms/plain navy bottoms/leggings. In the Spring and Summer months shorts can be worn as part of the school uniform.

With a variety of shorts been worn by pupils to school and feedback from parents and pupils highlighting that the current white shorts are very difficult to keep clean, we are in the process of reviewing the school shorts uniform. Contact has been made with O'Neill's to design a pair of leisure shorts with pockets similar to the school tracksuit bottoms. It is hoped that the new shorts will be available to purchase for September.

We are extremely mindful of school uniform costs and we would like to state that school shorts are optional. Parents/Guardians are not expected to purchase the current uniform shorts for term three and plain navy shorts are acceptable for the interim.

SCHOOL CAR PARK & ROAD SAFETY

For morning arrival/drop off parents/guardians/childminders are free to use school playground car park but must drive **slowly, carefully and responsibly**, showing regard at all times.

At home time collection we ask parents/family members/childminders to please collect their child/children safely from their class lines and move swiftly to their vehicle with awareness of other adults and children in the area.

The double entrance playground gates are closed each morning at 9am.

Gates will reopen again at 1:30pm for P1 and P2 pupil home collection.

Gates will close again from 2pm until 2:30pm to allow for outdoor learning and PE lessons. We thank everyone for adhering to these times and guidelines as it ensures the safety of the children and staff throughout the day.

The small gate at the front of the school will remain accessible for late arrivals, visitors and deliveries to access the school front reception area.

We would also ask all parents/guardians/family members to please refrain from parking at the entrance gate or on the footpath in front of the school. This is a set down area ONLY and should

be kept clear at all times. This is particularly important with regard to the safety of the whole school community especially for the crossing patrol.



PUPIL COLLECTION ON WET DAYS

Reminder: Pupil home time collection is from the school hall when there are **wet/poor** weather conditions.

To assist in the management of this, P3-P7 children will line up in the school hall and will only be allowed to leave class line if a parent/guardian/family member is there to collect them.

We thank you for co-operation and support with this school procedure.

The school bell will ring at <u>2:30pm daily</u> to allow the P3-P7 children to tidy up and get ready for home time to ensure they are collected on time and to avoid any delays for parents/family members

OUTDOOR CLIMBING FRAME

To ensure the Health and Safety of all pupils when using the Climbing Frame, the class teachers have discussed the rules with the pupils within their class. A copy of the rules for the safe and correct use of the Climbing Frame in school have been issued to all parents/guardians to discuss at home with their child/children.



PROMOTING POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

We pride ourselves in Derrychrin PS as having a high level of Pastoral Care and we always want our pupils to learn in an environment which is supportive, encouraging and structured. For learning to be effective, good discipline and positive behaviour is essential at whole school level. As a Catholic school, we wish to help our pupils understand that we all make mistakes or make the wrong choices sometimes, but mistakes are forgiven and forgotten.

We also highlight to our children that saying sorry, trying to put mistakes right and accepting appropriate consequences with good grace are part of learning and growing up.

Going forward as a school we aim to have in place a number of positive mottos, whole school Golden Rules and an established system of rewards which promotes positive behaviour.

We want our pupils to maintain their excellent attitude and application to their learning. However, in order to maintain these excellent standards, it is necessary to have effective rewards and sanctions in place. These are outlined in our revised Positive Behaviour Policy.



NEW SENSORY AREA

We are pleased to announce that we have recently installed a sensory environment in our reading room area.

The Multi-Sensory resource consists of:

- 2 Mirror Panels
- 1.75m Bubble Tube
- 2m 100 Strand Fibre Optics & Light Source
- I Square Podium
- I Quadrant Podium
- 1 Wall Pad
- Bubble Tube Bracket
- Deioinised Water
- 8 Colour Wireless Control



In preparation for the unique Causeway Sensory modular design to be fitted, shelves, cupboard units and sink area had to be removed and a small area of the room refurbished. We are currently in the process of painting the multi-sensory area and new carpet is to be fitted in term three.

The new multi-Sensory resource will be the perfect sensory environment to cater for all our pupils in a quiet, clam environment. Additional sensory equipment has also been acquired to stimulate and help children learn and develop in a safe and natural environment using play. AARON DEVLIN MEMORIAL TOURNAMENT

We are delighted to announce that our Annual Aaron Devlin Tournament has been confirmed again after a two-year absence due to COVID restrictions. It will take place on **Friday 17th June 2022** at Ballinderry Shamrocks GAA starting at **10:00am sharp**.

It is hoped that there will be 16 schools involved this year in the tournament with a separate boys' and girls' competition. Each school may enter only <u>one</u> team, Derrychrin PS as hosts will be entering two teams in both competitions.

The tournament will have an initial group stage, followed by knockout in both the Cup and Shield sections. The boys' tournament will be **9 a-side** and the girls' tournament **7 a-side**.

OUTDOOR GADREN AREA

The school along with our ECO Council have proposed plans in place to develop our outdoor garden area. This will also be part of our ECO Council action plan to maintain our 'Green Flag' status.

We have outlined a number of objectives in the aerial plan above that will be completed during term three.

These developments will provide the children with the opportunity to learn and play outside whatever the weather.

We are keen to avail of support from any parent or family members who would be willing to offer advice, and assistance with the following areas:

- make raised vegetable beds
- power wash perimeter wall next to the road.

As part of our School Development Plan for Year 2 and Year 3, we aim to further develop our ECO garden area and an outdoor learning area in the P1 and P2 playground area.



BIODIVERSITY & PLANTING

Thank you to Martin Wilson who has removed bushes, tree stumps and roots from various areas around the school grounds and planted a beech hedge in the climbing frame area. Thank you also to members of our **ECO Council**, Mrs Hassan, Siobhan, our caretaker and Nikki who have planted shrubs and fruit plants behind the rockery area and flower bed areas at the back perimeter fence. With new plant species added to the school grounds, it will attract a greater variety of insects and wildlife to support the children's understanding and learning of the outdoor world.

DINNER MONEY PAYMENT

We would like to express our appreciation to all parents/carers who have followed our revised arrangements for the payment of dinner and other monies. It is now a more manageable process for our admin team. We would like to remind all parents/carers that the school will continue with cash payments, but the following arrangements <u>are to be strictly adhered to in</u>

order for the smooth and timely administration of dinner and other monies sent in to school.

1. Dinner Money

- All Dinner Money must be paid in advance.
- Dinner money should be paid on a Monday morning for the week ahead <u>or</u> daily on the morning the dinner is to be taken.
- Dinner money must be brought in to the class teacher in an envelope/money bag (<u>containing</u> <u>only dinner money</u>) clearly labelled with child/children's name, class, dates and amount enclosed. Siblings can be included in the same envelope/moneybag but all details must be included. Thank you to all parents who already do this.
- Exact money would be appreciated but change will be given if required.
- If a dinner is paid for but not taken money will roll forward.

The Dinner Menu is available on the school website and is updated each month.

2. Other Monies

Music/Swimming Money must be paid on the day of the activity – as detailed above in a clearly labelled envelope/money bag.

P5 SWIMMING LESSONS

Swimming lessons for our P5 pupils commenced on Wednesday 5th April for eight weeks at the Greenvale Leisure Centre, Magherafelt. A fee of £3.50 per child covers the cost of swimming lessons and transport.

SHARED EDUCATION PROJECT

In Term One, we registered our interest in becoming involved in the Shared Education Project. We are now included in a list of schools and over the next 18 months the Education Authority will begin the process of forming partnerships.

The first introductory workshops were held across each locality at the end of March 2022. These sessions helped to raise the awareness of Shared Education, build an understanding of what Shared Education is, the benefits of Shared Education and provide a timeline for learning to all those involved in the programme. ourselves as one of the participating schools.
